## **Australian Seed Testing Laboratories**

The ASF is the peak industry body for the Australian seed industry at the local, state, national and international level. The ASF has compiled this listing to identify Australian seed testing laboratories and their accreditations and associations.

ISTA and NATA provide for the accreditation of seed testing laboratories. Accreditation is granted according to technical competence and compliance with ISO/IEC 17025 (standard for testing and calibration laboratories). ISTA laboratories are able to issue Orange and Blue International Certificates, which are sometimes required for international trade in seed.

**ASF Membership:** The ASF is the peak industry body for the Australian seed industry at the local, state, national and international level. The ASF also represents its members internationally, as a member of the International Seed Federation (ISF) and the Asia Pacific Seed Association (APSA). <u>www.asf.asn.au</u>.

**ISTA Accreditation:** For more than 80 years ISTA has stood for uniformity in seed testing. The aim of ISTA Accreditation is to verify if a seed testing laboratory is technically competent to carry out seed testing procedures in accordance with the ISTA Rules. Accredited laboratories must show that they run a quality management system fulfilling the requirements of the ISTA Laboratory Accreditation Standard. These are the only laboratories that can issue Orange International Certificates for seed export. <u>www.seedtest.org</u>

**NATA accreditation**: Provides a means of determining, formally recognising and promoting the competence of facilities to perform specific types of testing, inspection, calibration, and other related activities. NATA's accreditation is based on a peer-review process made possible by some 3000 volunteer experts who assist with the assessment of facilities and sit on NATA's various technical committees. To maintain accreditation, facilities must be re-assessed regularly. <u>www.nata.com.au</u>
